4. Amendments to the FY 2015 - 2018 Transportation Improvement Program

Ms. Wykoda Wang stated that in September 2014 the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) requested to amend the TIP to increase the cost estimates for #PI 0012722, I-95@ SR 21 Diverging Diamond project from \$3,641,400 to \$6,698,955. The added funding comes from the state, and so the amendment does not negatively impact other TIP projects.

Another amendment involves Chatham Area Transit's (CAT's) requested funding for two special studies in FY 2015, Regional Mobility Management Program and Service Tactical Optimization Process Route Level Profile Analysis, Monitoring and Response. Since CORE MPO set aside \$750,000 for special transportation studies in FY 2015 with PI 0010563, a portion of that funding is to be split out and assigned to the CAT studies, as a project with its own PI number.

5. Adoption of the Non-motorized Transportation Plan

Ms. Jane Love stated The CORE MPO Non-motorized Transportation Plan is a bicycle and pedestrian plan that serves as an update to the Chatham County Bikeway Plan and also now includes pedestrian projects.

MPOs must address multiple modes in transportation planning. Projects in the Non-motorized Transportation Plan are listed in the MPO's Total Mobility Plan (2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan). The projects will thus be eligible for federal funding, although local governments may opt to implement some of the projects over time with entirely local funding. The majority of projects in the Non-motorized Transportation Plan currently have no funding, either federal or local. Some projects will be implemented over time as part of funded roadway projects, while a few will be implemented as stand-alone projects, in cooperation with local sponsors, using the MPO's Transportation Alternatives funding or MPO urban-attributable funding as available.

Ms. Love reviewed the process for developing this plan, including the public participation. She reviewed projects included in the pedestrian and bicycle section of the plan by northwest, southwest, central, and east portions of the county. After reviewing all the pedestrian and bicycle projects she noted the top five scoring projects and reviewed the criteria used to score the projects.

Ms. Wang reviewed the time line and goals of the study. She reviewed the seven identified park and ride lot sites in three different corridors. The review included the lot development alternatives, development costs, and maintenance costs. She also reviewed possible transit service potential and costs. For each corridor, it is proposed that there be one route to each destination. Each route would start from the farthest park and ride lot, make a mid-route stop at the closest park and ride lot, then continue non-stop to the employment destination.

The recommended implementation strategy begins with park and ride lot development, then implementation of a carpool/vanpool program, and lastly development of regional commuter transit service.

7. TCC Bylaws Update

Mr. Thomson reminded the committee that the MPO is in the process of updating all of the bylaws as well as the Memorandum of Understanding, due to the need to expand the planning area and adjust membership because of the larger Census-defined Urbanized Area in 2010.

The current members of the CORE MPO Board and the advisory committees come from within Chatham County. With the establishment of CORE MPO as a three-county regional transportation planning agency, the compositions of the CORE MPO Board as well as its advisory committees need to be updated to reflect the regional character of the membership. There has been a working group, comprised of staff members from various agencies in the three counties, and it has proposed an updated CORE MPO Board structure.

The bylaws of the CORE MPO Board and the advisory committees define the membership of each committee, the roles, responsibilities and duties of each member, the procedures to conduct the meetings, as well as other related issues. It has been determined that each committee will work on the specifics of its bylaws and then forward the finalized bylaws to the CORE MPO Board for adoption. Mr. Thomson gave an overview of the proposed TCC bylaws by noting the headers of each section.

Mr. Thomson gave an update to included the first steps in the CORE MPO's re-apportionment process is determining the MPA boundary through a cooperative working process between the MPO representatives, the Governor and any adjacent MPOs. The establishment of the planning boundary will provide the basis for all other re-apportionment undertakings. CORE MPO has been working with the

City of Richmond Hill, Bryan County, and Effingham County to establish the MPA.

The time line for completing this re-apportionment, is to obtain board approval of the MOU and hopefully the bylaws in December 2014. Then all the jurisdictions (local, state, federal) involved need to sign on, hopefully by July 2015, so that the new CORE MPO can begin the new fiscal year on July 1, 2015.

To formalize the CORE MPO's planning boundary and organization, committee composition and funding agreements, the MPO's Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and bylaws must be updated as a part of the re-apportionment process. The working group has met seven times between April and July 2014 to draft the revised MOU document and format the bylaws of the committees.

If the proposed MPA boundary is approved, CORE MPO will conduct transportation planning in the area with a total population of more than 276,000.

The question was asked whether CORE MPO is now allocated more funding since the Census increased the urbanized area. The answer was, "No. Our formula funding is based on our Urbanized Area's share of the population of all of the Urbanized Areas in the state. Because Atlanta's Urbanized Area increased more then all the others, CORE MPO actually gets less than before."

Mr. Thomson explained that a few scenarios were being considered as far as member dues. The federal planning funds used to conduct the required planning process must have local matching funds. In the past, the match has been provided by City of Savannah and Chatham County. In fairness, the idea gong forward is to share the cost of matching among all the jurisdictions. Dues will be population based, but decisions to consider include: Round all dues up to the nearest \$1000? Should there be a "floor" limiting how low the dues are for the smallest towns?

Mr. Thomson reviewed the working group's thinking about representation on the MPO Board. At this time, the proposal would still add up to 22 members, but the board would be constituted differently.
