2017 CALL FOR PROJECTS

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (Z230) funds, provided through the act entitled Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (also known as FAST Act).

- Expected Available Funds = \$13 million (federal portion)
- Maximum Award = N/A
- Minimum Award = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded. (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)

An applicant may request for *at least \$200,000 of federal funds*. The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

• Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the STBG funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

• Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO administered STBG Urban Attributable funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County, the portion of Effingham County and Bryan County located within the Savannah Urbanized Area, as well as Richmond Hill.

Projects, if awarded funds, will be programmed in the CORE MPO's FY 2018 – 2021
 Transportation Improvement Program (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2021).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in a certain federal fiscal year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

The City has just completed the preliminary engineering and environmental studies to satisfy an Environmental Assessment at a cost of \$3,403,735 with local funding. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) has determined that the project qualified environmental impacts associated with the project went beyond an Environmental Assessment and the project will need to convert to an Environmental Impact Statement. Therefore, the City is requesting federal funding to complete the necessary Environmental documentation and Design phase, which estimated cost is \$3,000,000.

The DeRenne Avenue corridor is the worst traffic congestion problem in the City of Savannah. The problem became more critical when the first two phases of the Truman Parkway was completed between President Street and DeRenne Avenue. Commuters from the Islands use Truman Parkway to get to DcRenne Avenue for their commute, which added to the congestion problem along this corridor. The segment of DeRenne Avenue between Montgomery Street and Abercorn (SR204) Street carries approximately 50,000 vehicles per day, out of which 25,000 have a destination to the south side of the City and the rest continue east of the Truman Parkway. The segment of DeRenne Avenue between Abercorn and the Truman Parkway carries approximately 36,000 vehicles per day.

Some of the major traffic generators along DeRenne Avenue corridor starting on the west side of the street is Hunter Army Airfield, which main entrance is on Montgomery Street just south of DeRenne Avenue. DeRenne Avenue between Montgomery and Abercorn Streets, is commercial on both sides of the street consisting of several strip centers, fast food restaurants, service stations, and specialty stores.

On the north side of DeRenne east of Habersham Street, are two hospitals: Candler/St. Joseph, between Reynolds and Paulsen, and Memorial Hospital Trauma Center, located north of DeRenne Avenue, it's main public access off Waters Avenue and emergency access on DeRenne Avenue at the intersection of Ranger Street. Also, on the north side of DeRenne Avenue are a number of medical centers that support the hospitals and various other related medical and professional services.

This project will provide a great relieve of congestion for motorist and enhance the economic vitality of the corridor by providing a better route for freight though the City.

This project will reduce vehicular crashes and provide safer pedestrian conditions by the enhancement of crosswalks and installation of pedestrian sidewalks on both sides of the street.

This project will also improve mobility and connectivity for other modes of transportation. This is especially true for bicycles, with the implementation of a multi-use facility along the Boulevard section which will connect to the Hunter Army Airfield bicycle facility on the west side and to provide future connectivity to the Truman Linear Park Trail on the east side of the project.

Furthermore, this project will provide safer and more efficient traffic flow conditions during evacuations due to natural disasters as this facility is designated as ta evacuation route by Chatham County.
